

TOUR PERMIT POLICY

Coronado Area Council, Boy Scouts of America

Revision Date: July 2006

- **When a Local Tour Permit is required:**

1. All trips that will take place overnight.
2. All trips that will take place outside of the Coronado Area Council boundaries.
3. All activities that include: A) Aquatics, B) COPE, C) Climbing, D) Rappelling or E) Shooting Sports (Boy Scouts & Ventures with rifles, etc.)

- **When a Local Tour Permit is not needed:**

1. All field trips that only take place during one day within the Coronado Area Council and do not include aquatics, COPE, climbing, rappelling or Shooting Sports for Boy Scouts and Ventures (ie: rifle shooting).

- **When a National Tour Permit is required:**

1. Any trip that is 500 miles or more one way of the location where your unit regularly meets.
2. Any trip to a National High Adventure Base.
3. National Tour Permits can be done electronically, and will be approved faster. .

- **Filing a Local Tour Permit – only Tour Permits dates 2006 & 2007 accepted**

1. Must be received by the council service center two weeks prior to your trip.
2. All tour permit applications must be printed neatly or typed.
3. Remember to answer all questions and have a member of the committee sign. (The committee must approve all activities of their unit.)

- **Parent Permission Slips**

Units are encouraged to use Parent Permission Slips for all activities. The Scout Service Center has a form that can be used, that includes parent's phone number for the time during the activity. Permission slips allow the tour leader and the Scout's parent to have current information and do not need to be filed with the council service center.
